



65 ter summary:

The Witness is a retired member of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Serbia. He was the deputy of Sreten Lukic in the MUP Staff in Pristina.

The Witness will describe his engagements in Kosovo and Metohija, before 1999. He will explain that MUP in Kosovo and Metohija didn't have enough policemen to do their job of law enforcement because ethnic Albanians in Kosovo-Methoja refused to participate in the Police. The Witness will explain that the security situation in Kosovo and Metohija radically changed during 1997, and 1998, due to increasing terrorist acts and threats.

The Witness will testify about his last assignment in Kosovo and Metohija, from 15 July 1998 to 31 May 1999 as a MUP Staff member. The Witness will explain in detail the MUP Staff's structure, personnel and members, and authorities, during the period of time he spent in Kosovo-Metohija.

The Witness will testify that the RJB and RDB were completely separated and autonomous from each other within the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Serbia. He will testify that none of the Members of the MUP Staff in Pristina, including

Sreten Lukic, could issue any orders to RDB personnel, such as the JSO. He will also testify that no RDB personnel were members of the MUP Staff and will specifically deny that either David Gajic or Milorad "Legia" Lukovic of the RDB were members of the MUP Staff.

The Witness will explain that the MUP Staff didn't have the authority for planning, organizing and participating in any anti-terrorist actions. Witness will explain how the anti-terrorist actions were planned in 1998 and 1999, including who created the plans and how police forces were included in the same and will explain the extent of the MUP and MUP Staff's participation in this, if any. Witness will also describe the role of the MUP Staff in assisting in the implementation of the actions.

The Witness will give a detailed picture of how the joint VJ/MUP anti-terrorist actions were implemented. He will describe the joint VJ/MUP meetings, documents, maps, and MUP units participating in actions. Witness will explain what role and relevance of the MUP Staff had in conducting of anti-terrorist actions. He will describe the condition of radio communications in 1998 and 1999, and MUP Staff's possibilities to communicate with the field.

Witness will give a detailed explanation of relations between the MUP, MUP Staff, SUP's and other organization units in Kosovo and Metohija within the MUP structure. He will explain MUP Staff's position in organizational structure of MUP, and relations to different organization units. Witness will explain that Mr Sreten Lukic was "manager" (rukovodilac) of MUP Staff, and the limited extent of authority he had related to his position. He will make a distinction between "manager" (rukovodilac), and "chief" (nacelnik) within the MUP.

Witness will discuss the makeup, structure and functioning of the MUP Staff, including hardships encountered following commencement of NATO bombing and disrupted communications.

He will explain reporting through the various lines of communication within the MUP, as well as the existence of various lines of subordination and instruction in MUP and their autonomy from one another. He will particularly describe the various separate structures within the RJB and their functioning, including the SAJ (Special Anti-Terrorist Unit), OKP/UKP (Criminalistic Police), PJP/OPG (Separate Police Units/Operative Sweep Groups), SUP (Secretariat of the Interior), OUP (Department of the Interior), PS (Police Station), Police Detachment, RPO (Reserve Police Detachment), UP (Police Administration), Administration for Border Issues and Foreigners, Administration of the Traffic Police, Operative Center, Administration for Fire Prevention, Administration of Analysis, Administration for I.T., Administration for Communications and Cryptography, and Administration for Joint Work, among others.

He will testify that Sreten Lukic did not have command superior authority over the PJP/OPG, SAJ, SUP, OUP, PS, Police Detachment, RPO, UP, and various Police Administrations. He will testify that the Decision on Appointment of the MUP Staff (P2166) was never put into practice because it was pre-empted by the Plan for Suppressing Terrorism that was Prepared at the Highest State Level in Belgrade, and, although created without the participation of the MUP, envisaged the employment of MUP Forces in carrying out this legitimate anti-terrorist plan.

The Witness will discuss his knowledge of the difficult situation on the ground created by the Albanian separatist terrorists which brought about the need for anti-terrorist activities. He will discuss the criminal acts committed by the Albanian terrorists that disrupted roadways, cut off inhabited areas, disrupted safety in the province, and led to a large part of the province of Kosovo-Metohija being outside the control of the State, leading to the killings, kidnappings, and forced displacement of both Albanian and non-Albanian inhabitants at the hands of the KLA. He will likewise discuss the time period leading up to the so-called "October Accords" that ushered in the KVM. He will discuss the interactions of the MUP with the KDOM, KVM, and other diplomatic and international initiatives relating to Kosovo-Metohija. He will testify as to his observations of the

behavior of various members of the KVM and KDOM, and his knowledge of the actions of the KLA in conjunction with the KVM.

He will also testify about the efforts of the MUP to assist in the Rambouillet negotiations, providing security for transport of KLA and Albanian delegates to that negotiation that were departing from Kosovo-Metohija. He will also testify about the departure of the KVM Mission, and the steps taken by the MUP to assist in this regard. The Witness will testify as to the offensive launched by the KLA at that time and the escalation of KLA attacks.

The Witness will also testify about the time period of the NATO War against Yugoslavia, including the bombing of MUP structures and the effect that this had on the functioning of the same. He will testify about the affect of the bombings on civilian centers in Kosovo-Metohija. He will testify about the creation of daily sit-reps by the MUP Staff during this time period and also before the bombing. He will discuss how the bombing of the MUP Building in Pristina affected the work and communication of the MUP Staff.

He will testify that he knows nothing of any so-called "JOINT COMMAND" existing as a separate command structure in Kosovo-Metohija. He will testify that the MUP structures in Kosovo-Metohija remained unchanged throughout.

With regard to the KVM, as the Principal Liaison on the part of the MUP with this mission, he will describe his good faith participation in daily meetings and cooperation with the mission, as well as adherence of the MUP to the terms of the various October Accords. He will in this regard comment upon and confront and refute certain testimony of KVM and KDOM personnel in these proceedings.

He will testify that the MUP Staff neither had knowledge of nor participated in the clandestine removal of bodies from Kosovo-Metohija to Central Serbia. In that regard he will confront and refute certain testimony of OTP witness Bozidar Protic. He will testify

that the only “Asanacija” (Sanitization) of the terrain that the MUP Staff was aware of in 1999 was the legal and proper job of investigating any dead bodies on the terrain, investigating, documenting and processing the same in accordance with the laws in place, undertaken exclusively by the UKP/OKP within their domain of authority and jurisdiction.

The Witness will testify about the lack of any knowledge or credible information as to the existence of paramilitaries on the territory of Kosovo-Metohija, and that such groups would have been confronted and arrested by the MUP if encountered.

He will testify as to the proper functioning of the police in a time of dire circumstances, trying to uphold law and order and perform their regular functions in a time of war, when NATO threatened from above and terrorist forces posed a threat to life and limb from the ground. Toward that end he will testify about Police forces that lost their lives in the conduct of upholding law and order for citizens of all ethnicities on the territory of Kosovo-Metohija.

65 ter summary:

The Witness is a retired member of the Serbian MUP. From 1 January 1999 to 15 July 1999, the witness was Chief of SUP in Gnjilane.

Witness will testify about the organizational structure of SUP Gnjilane, OUP's and police station within the organization of the SUP. He will speak about the personnel and heads of organizational units within SUP Gnjilane, The Witness will give details about the national/ethnic/religious structure of the population in the jurisdiction of the Gnjilane SUP. The Witness will testify about the work of the SUP, and the tasking of the SUP to protect law and order for citizens of all national/ethnic/religious groups.

The Witness will testify about the system of reporting and informing within the Serbian MUP. He will testify about the authority and duty of Heads of SUP within the structure of the RJB of the MUP. He will also testify about the various lines of service within the MUP, including the structure of the same. He will testify about his knowledge of the structure, functioning, authority and practices of the MUP Staff for KIM.

Witness will give detailed data about the number of issued passports, ID's and registration of domicile, till 15 June 1999.

The Witness will testify about the efforts of his SUP to prevent criminal acts committed within his SUP's geographic area, including arrests and detentions of perpetrators, irrespective of their identity.

The Witness will describe and explain the cooperation of the SUP with the KVM and/or KDOM in Gnjilane (Regional center). He will testify about the acts of the verifiers which were in conflict with the terms of the signed agreement. The Witness will speak about the meetings held with KVM personnel and other aspects of cooperation and work with Kosovo Verification Mission.

Witness will describe the situation in SUP Gnjilane area during 1999 before and after the start of NATO bombing. He will emphasize that, before the start of bombing, on his area of responsibility, there was no cases of rapes, deporting, burnings, or other crimes. In that period of time only one case of terrorism happened. He will testify as to the peaceful coexistence of citizens within his area, and the activities of the KLA in his and neighboring areas.

Witness will explain the measures taken during the state of war on preventing and punishing of all sort of crimes in area of SUP Gnjilane

Witness will describe the period of NATO bombing. He will describe the bombing of Gnjilane and atmosphere of fear and panic among the civilians after the destruction to life and property caused by NATO bombing. He will testify about the measures taken to prevent crimes and ethnic based revenge. He will speak about the persons taken into custody during that period. He will discuss difficulties encountered by the SUP in carrying out its tasks, caused by the NATO bombings and activities of terrorists.

Witness will speak about the cooperation and interaction between the MUP and VJ within his area. Witness will testify about criminal investigations conducted in his area of responsibility.

Witness will testify about the migration of civilians which started at the beginning of bombing. He will explain the known reasons why Albanian civilian population left their homes. He will describe efforts by the police to encourage people to return to their homes during this time period, and their interactions with Albanian civilians.

Witness will give details on dates and villages where Albanians left their homes. He will specifically give a testimony about the village of Prilepnica.

Witness will describe arrests and discipline of MUP/VJ personnel. He will testify that he received full support from Sreten Lukic in arresting perpetrators of crimes, even those who were policemen. He will testify about some of prominent names from Gnjilane he arrested. He will discuss the functioning of the disciplinary regime within the MUP of the Republic of Serbia.

Witness will testify about dispatches he received from MUP and MUP Staff, and his responses on them, as well as their significance.

Witness will testify about the onsite investigations in area of SUP Gnjilane (Vladovo, Vlastica, Donja Stubla and other villages), and give a numerical overview of criminal denunciations betaken during this period.

Witness will testify about the PJP units that operated in his area, about his relations with PJP, his authority and PJP chain of command, reporting and informing. He will also give a testimony about his relations with JSO and SAJ.

Witness will testify about the relations between RDB and RJB.

The Witness will testify about relations between the MUP and civilian authorities.

Witness will explain the state of communications during the war, and problems that police members had to establish stable communications.

He will also specifically address the testimony of Abdylhaqim Shaqiri.

Witness is currently an Investigative Judge of the District Court in Kragujevac. During the period of time relevant for Indictment, she worked as an Investigative Judge of the District Court in Pristina.

She will explain the work and functioning of Investigative judges within the judiciary system as well as the judiciary system as a whole. Witness will describe her territorial jurisdiction and prosecution of criminal acts under her jurisdiction. Witness will explain the relations in jurisdiction between MUP and Investigative judge, as well as the authorities and duties of each. In the course of this she will explain the manner in which investigations were carried out, in accordance with the applicable laws.

She will testify about some characteristic cases in Kosovo and Metohija on which she worked. She will authenticate and comment on and explain the documents related to those cases.

The Witness will describe the cases of prosecuting perpetrators of terrorism on which she worked. She took part in numerous investigations for suspected criminal act of terrorism. She will comment and explain documents from investigations of such crimes. Witness

will describe the murders of civilians at the hands of KLA and criminals. In her testimony she will give other examples of urban terrorism, on which cases she worked. She also made an investigation on cases of NATO bombing, which she will also describe in her testimony.

Witness will give the list of conducted measures on investigation of attacks on MUP members, their buildings, attacks on Serb and Albanian civilians, and hotelier buildings owned by Albanians.

Witness will emphasize that the investigation were conducted irrespective of the nationality of the victims or perpetrators.

The Witness was a communications specialist within the MUP of Serbia.

The Witness will explain his knowledge of the foundation and tasks of the MUP Staff, the period of time on which members of the MUP Staff were appointed, and the relation between the duties in SUP Pristina, and MUP Staff for members of MUP Staff appointed from SUP Pristina.

Witness will give detailed explanation of all MUP communication systems in Kosovo and Metohija. Witness will describe the use of landlines and mobile lines in MUP in Kosovo and Metohija. He will describe the special and regular systems of communications used in telephony system. He will speak about the radio communications used by MUP organs, so as the telegraph systems used in Kosovo and Metohija for transfer of writing notes.

Witness will testify about the transfer of coded dispatches during the 1998 and 1999. He will explain the only system which SUP's and MUP Staff could use to pass the dispatches.

He will show that MUP in Kosovo and Metohija didn't have any separate and different communication system related to the other part of Serbian MUP.

Witness will give theoretical and practical explanation of radio networks and hertzian waves, and explain the functioning of radio communications and command radio channels in Kosovo SUP's and MUP. He will describe the way of use of that command channel.

Witness will explain which measures were taken in 1998 to prevent and stop disturbing of radio communications of MUP members, by terrorists. He will describe all types of measures used for that purpose.

Witness will describe telecommunication systems in province of Kosovo and Metohija. He will explain that Pristina was better connected with other parts of Serbia than the rest of province. Witness will explain that MUP used this, civilian capacities, and that MUP's telephone network was organized on the same principles as civilian.

Witness will testify about hardships and disruptions experienced in MUP communications as a result of NATO bombings. He will explain that NATO targeted broadcasting objects in Kosovo and Metohija.

Witness will testify that the bombing of Telecom building in Pristina, on 6 April 1999, completely disabled receiving the information from SUP's in Kosovo and Metohija. This bombing had the same effect on telegraph system of MUP in Kosovo and Metohija. Witness will confirm that the cable systems in the cities of Kosovo and Metohija were seriously damaged. Witness will explain how this serious damage of telecommunications influenced to the MUP Staff's ability to communicate with outside world.

Witness will testify about the Manual for use of radio-telegraph communication systems. He will explain the use of VHF, UHF channels and code names. He will speak about the use of directories for actions and regular tasks.
