Concerning: Health condition of Mr. Jovica Stanisic, DoB 30 July 1950

Dear Sir,

Further to the Chamber's request, dated 24 April 2009, for a weekly medical report on the health of Mr. Jovica Stanisic, I would like to provide you with the most recent information. Mr. Stanisic has given his informed consent to release this information.

1. I have examined Mr. Jovica Stanisic today.
2. Mr. Jovica Stanisic's colitis is stable; his kidney stones have not troubled him this last week; he has not complained of back problems; the function of his leg is nearly normal again.
3. Mr. Jovica Stanisic is clearly more stressed than last week; although he states being more depressed due to the stress caused by waiting for the Chamber's decision, his state of mind is active reviewing his chances. He hopes being permitted to address his personal problems personally in Belgrade. Mr. Jovica Stanisic was intellectually active during consultations, his affect fluctuated normally. His attention span was normal and his orientation was good; his memory, perception and judgement were intact.
4. It has been established, that Mr. Stanisic is able to participate in the proceedings in the court for up to 5 hours if divided in periods of 1 hour and 15 minutes separated by a 30 minutes break, as described in the Decision Amending Modalities for Trial.

I will of course provide you with reports as requested and keep you informed of developments as they occur.
